
Chapter 2 – Part 2 of 3 - The Outpost - The Chaplain as a Soul Winner

A wise outpost chaplain will become proficient in soul winning.

He will prepare himself carefully and prayerfully for each outpost meeting, ready for the opportunity to lead a boy to Christ. When a boy makes a decision for Christ, the outpost chaplain needs to counsel with the boy and be sure he understands what he has just done. There are probably questions the boy might have about salvation and what it means to be "saved."

Some typical questions a boy might have are:

- "In Matthew 3, John was baptizing people in the river what did he mean by that?"
- "In John 3, what did Jesus mean when He told Nicodemus that he had to be born again?"
- "What does it mean that Jesus lives in my heart?"

Continue to follow up with the boy, including providing a Bible for him to read. Additional training will be necessary, including prayer, our church doctrines, and holy living. Remember to consult with the group leaders, senior pastor, youth pastor, children's pastor, Sunday school teacher, and the parents to design a means to disciple him. We must eternally vigilant in our duties to truly "Evangelize, Equip and Empower the next generation of Christlike Men."

The Chaplain would do well to commit much of the materials in these chapters of the Leaders Manual to memory.
